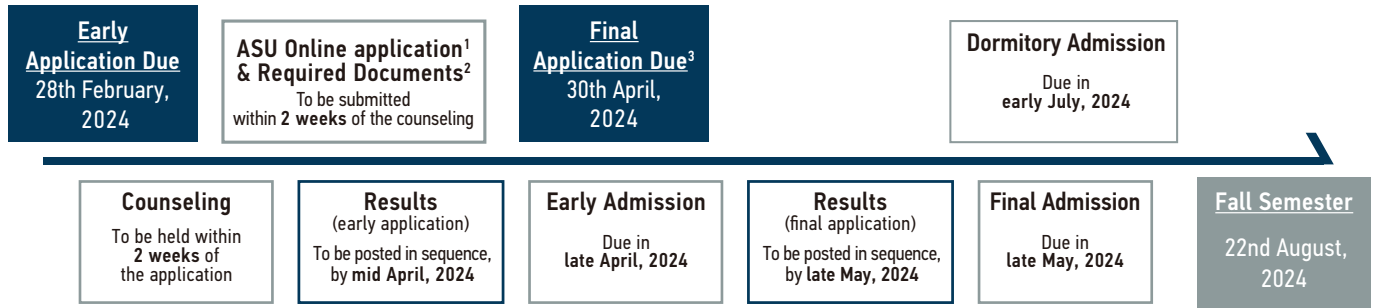


ADMISSION TIMELINE



- 1 A separate online application to Arizona State University (ASU) is required. Our staff will assist you with the application process.
- 2 Required documents for International school graduates
 - School transcript in English or IB score
 - English test scores (TOEFL 61 or IELTS 6.0 or above, taken within 2 years)

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

Score of at least 61 (iBT). ASU's institutional code is 4007. ASU accepts only electronic copies of the TOEFL score report.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

Overall band score of the academic test of at least 6.0. The general training exam is not accepted. No institutional code is needed.

However, if all the classes at your school are taught in English (other than foreign language classes), the above English proficiency test scores will be exempted, provided that a certificate issued by your international school is submitted. For the issuance of the certificate, please contact your school.

- 3 ASU Online application and all required documents must be submitted with or before the final application.

As of March, 2023

- * Those who apply by the early application deadline will receive an annual scholarship of \$7,000 for 4 years, making the annual tuition \$25,000.
- * Tuition will be paid in US dollars to our bank account.
- * An application fee of \$85 will be charged.
- * A deposit of \$500 is required at the time of admission. The deposit will be deducted from the tuition.
- * Please note that the application fee and deposit will not be refunded regardless of enrollment.
- * We have a scholarship system for all students. We will inform successful applicants of scholarship procedure.
- * Textbook fee is not included.

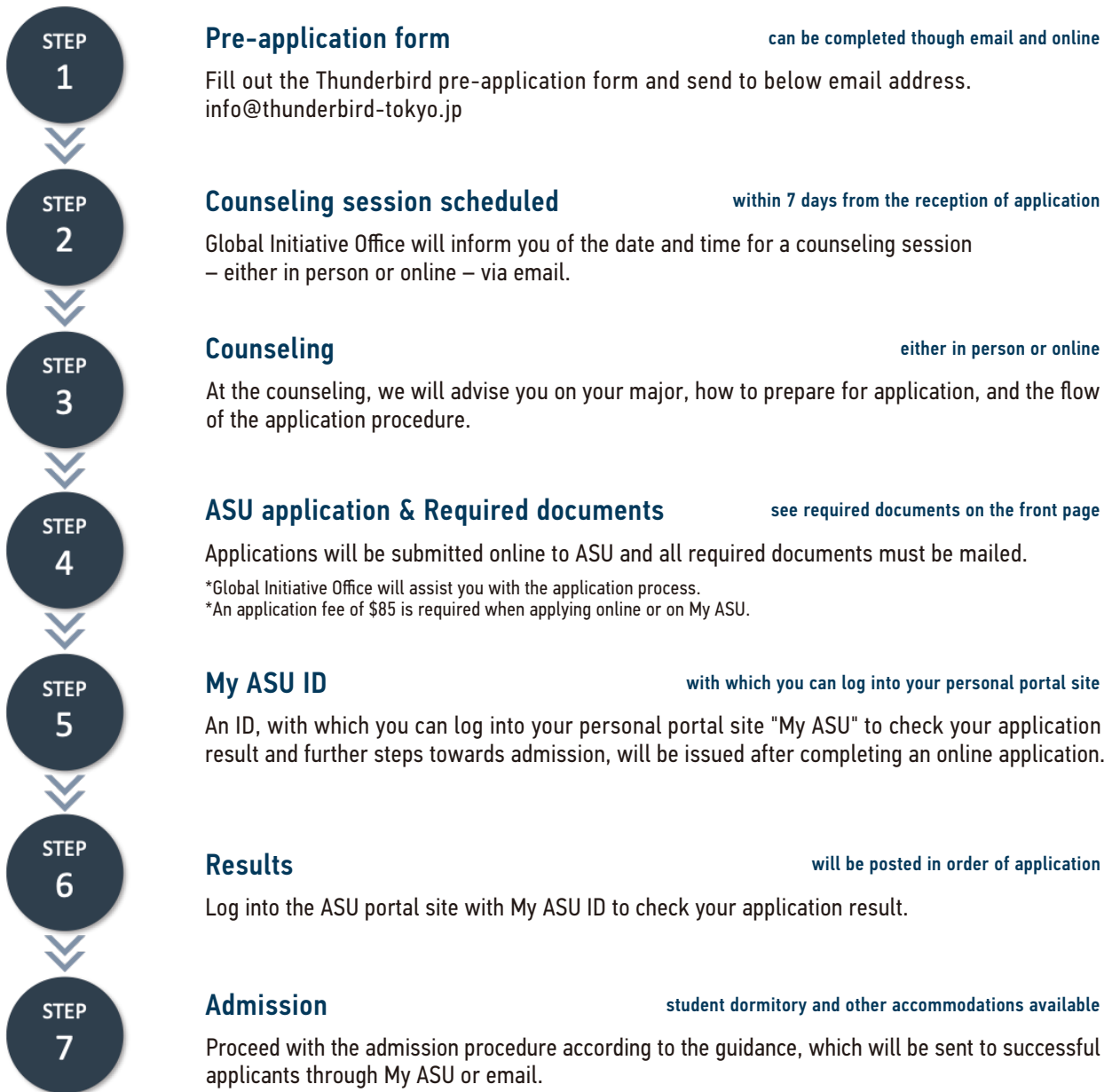

ADMISSION PROCEDURE



For foreign students with no Japanese citizenship:

- Apply for a Certificate of Eligibility at your local immigration office as soon as your application is accepted.
- Apply for a student visa at a Japanese embassy or consulate in your region as soon as the Certificate of Eligibility is issued. More information on how to apply for a Certificate of Eligibility can be found on another document.
- Reserve a flight ticket and let us know your arrival date, time and flight number.
