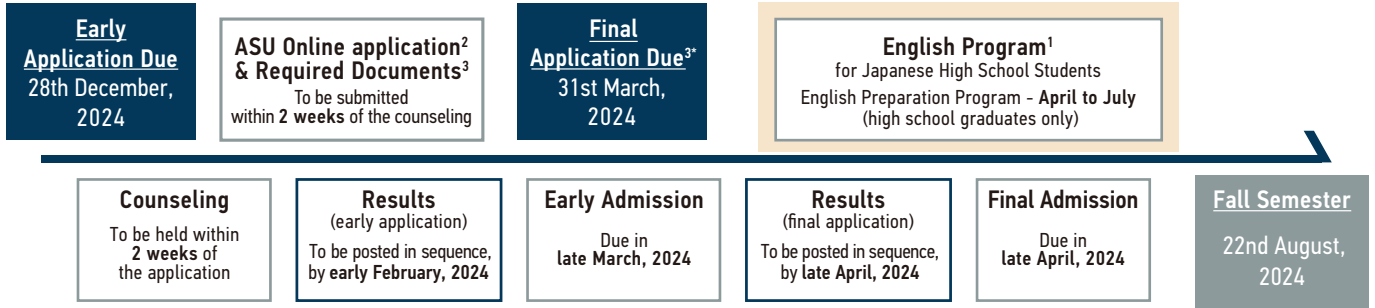


ADMISSION TIMELINE



- 1 English Program is an optional* "English Preparation Program" provided by Arizona State University (ASU) where students learn academic English online to prepare for the start of the classes.
- 2 A separate online application to Arizona State University is required. Our staff will assist you with the application process.
- 3 Required documents
 - School transcript in English for all subjects in high school + math from the final year of junior high school
 - English test scores (TOEFL 61 or IELTS 6.0 or above, taken within 2 years)

Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

Score of at least 61 (iBT). ASU's institutional code is 4007. ASU accepts only electronic copies of the TOEFL score report.

International English Language Testing System (IELTS)

Overall band score of the academic test of at least 6.0. The general training exam is not accepted. No institutional code is needed.

For those who do not have an English proficiency test score, you can meet the English admission criteria by taking and completing an 8-week intensive online English program with an 80% or better.

* ASU Online application and all required documents must be submitted with or before the final application.

TUITION

* Those who apply by the early application deadline will receive an annual scholarship of \$7,000 for 4 years, making the annual tuition \$25,000.

- * Tuition will be paid in US dollars to our bank account.
- * An application fee of \$85 will be charged.
- * A deposit of \$500 is required at the time of admission. The deposit will be deducted from the tuition.
- * Please note that the application fee and deposit will not be refunded regardless of enrollment.
- * We have a scholarship system for all students. We will inform successful applicants of scholarship procedure.
- * Textbook fee is not included.
