To refer prospective T-birds through the referral program, simply complete the online form and PDF recommendation letter at thunderbird.asu.edu/refer or email admissions.tbird@asu.edu.

The next steps are on us! Once we receive your recommendation form, we will:

- Contact your referral directly to discuss the opportunity
- Assess the candidate for acceptance into Thunderbird
- Notify accepted candidates about their scholarship award and admissions decision

Things to keep in mind

Thunderbird-funded scholarship awards are not stackable. This means that students are eligible for only one scholarship that is funded through the School.
